# Mōkihi



#### What is a Mokihi?

A Mōkihi is a raft made from raupō or kōrari. It is used when the lake is to deep to cross or to carry something down a river.

### How is a Mokihi made?

A Mōkihi is made using a rope 4 times the length of the raupō. When they start tie the raupō together you start at the middle of the raupō. Pulling the rope tight helps stopping the water getting through. Then you make another side and line them up together beside each other leaving a gap between. Soon you tie the two sides to make the stomach. After they flip the raupō over they tie more rope on the raupō. Finally tie the tops together to make the point at the top of the Mōkihi

## How does it Float

Pulling the rope the rope helps stop the water get through the Mōkihi. Finally the raupō has a pocket filled with air that would help it to float.


