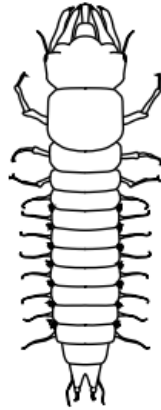

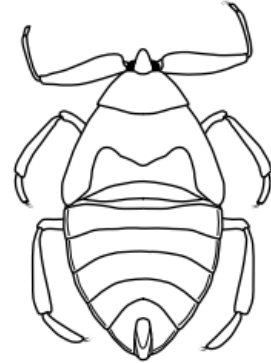

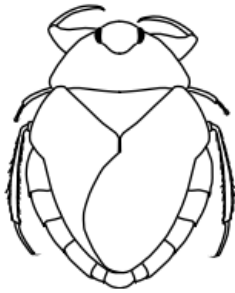

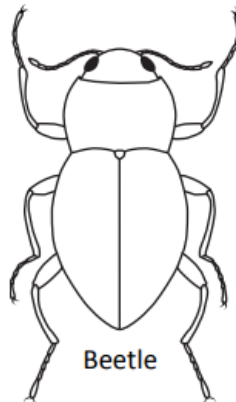


Giant Water Bug

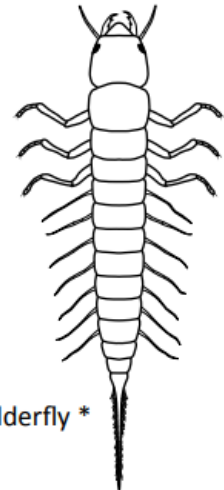


Creeping Water Bug

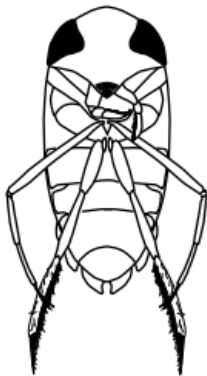
