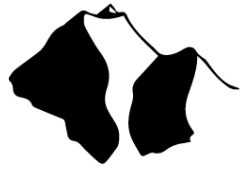
You may have noticed we're not asking about travel from home to school - this should still be communicated directly to your bus driver.

We will use the information you have provided to create a bus roll call for each day. If you need to change the information temporarily if your child is away from school, or permanently, you will need to call the school office or leave a note using the attendance facility on the school website or SchoolBridge app. The office will then adjust the bus roll for the teacher in charge at the end of the school day.

At the end of the school day, bus students will meet in the Middle School Courtyard for a roll call with a teacher. They will be lined up and escorted to the bus.
