Student User Agreement: Primary 2026

Twizel Area School has referred to the Netsafe website for current guidelines of best practice for digital devices and online expectations.

When I use digital technologies at Twizel Area School and at home, I will be a good digital citizen. This means:

Be a smart and safe technology user.

I will try my best to use technology well. If I don't understand something, I will ask for help.

Use technology for learning and fun in the right way.

I know that technology can help me learn, create, play, and talk to others. I will use it at the right time and for the right reasons.

Think before I believe things online.

Not everything I see or read online is real, factual or truthful. I will check with an adult if I'm not sure.

Be kind to other people online.

I will use kind words and be respectful when I communicate with others online and be considerate of others' feelings.

Know that sometimes things go wrong and ask for help.

If something makes me feel upset, confused, or unsafe online, I will talk to a trusted adult.

Respect people's privacy.

I will protect my personal and private information (like my full name, address, passwords, photos) and that of others, and won't share information without asking a trusted adult first.

Help others to be safe and kind online.

If I see someone being treated unfairly online, I will tell an adult and try to help.

Be responsible and be honest.

I will follow these guidelines when I use technology and I will ask a trusted adult if I don't know what's right.

Twizel Area School agrees to:

- Help you know how to stay safe online
- Oversee students' use of technology
- Have learning times about positive online behaviours and ways to stay safe
- Help you deal with online problems, even if they happen outside school hours
- Using filtering software to protect school devices
